## 2220 Instruction | School Calendar

## WORK OF COMMIITEE

- Review late start for 2022-2023 school year
- Create calendar drafts for the 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26 school years.

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Superintendent Maxwell provided background on the proposed change to the 2022-2023 academic calendar to remove $1 / 2$ day collaboration days and redistribute that time as late start Mondays (the late start would be no more than 60 minutes). This is in response to the district's initiatives as they relate to Professional Learning Communities.

The committee broke into small groups to discuss the pros and cons of potential late-start Mondays. The district will follow up with the committee on the questions they had around late start Mondays.

## DISCUSSION (i.e. pros/cons, questions, concerns):

- Would after school care be easier to arrange for childcare?
- What time do daycares open in the morning?
- Would YMCA be an option in the morning?
- For students that rely on school breakfast - what would the impact be on them?
- Parent voice - Is there a way to gather feedback from families on their preference?
- Committee representatives are available to gather feedback. There will also be a link on our website for families to provide feedback.
- How would an early release on Monday affect sports/clubs/activities?
- There would be an impact on student transportation - getting students back to school for after school clubs/sports/actitivities.
- Para trainings typically occur during collaboration days. How would late start Mondays affect para trainings?
- Late starts would benefit student learning and staff and would create continuity.
- Monday is better than Friday.
- How would late start Mondays impact zero period?
- Monday mornings could be challenging for working families - midweek may be a better option to consider.
- Teacher fatigue in afternoon sessions if changed to an early release instead of a late start.


## There was consensus to move away from $1 / 2$ day collaborations to a schedule that is more consistent on a weekly basis.

In addition, the committee was presented with a Draft A and Draft B for the academic calendars for the 2023-2024, 2024-2025, and 2025-2026 school years. Draft A included a 5-day Thanksgiving Break and is similar to the 2021-2022 academic calendar. Draft B had a 2.5 -day Thanksgiving Break with the last day of the school year being a $1 / 2$ day Wednesday in June which then makes the next Thursday/Friday make up snow days. Spring break was listed as the first full week of April on both drafts.

The next meeting will be February 24 and the representatives will continue their discussions on the calendar drafts. Input can be provided to committee representatives.
