## McKinney-Vento Act 42 U.S.C. 11435

## For purposes of this subtitle:

- 1. The terms "enroll" and "enrollment" include attending classes and participating fully in school activities.
- 2. The term "homeless children and youths":
  - a. means individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence (within the meaning of section 103(a)(1)); and
  - b. includes children and youths who are:
    - i. sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason;
    - ii. living in shelters, emergency shelters, or transitional housing/shelters;
    - iii. living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations;
    - iv. living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
    - v. children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;
    - vi. are abandoned in hospitals; and
    - vii. migratory children (as such term is defined in section 1309 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965) who qualify as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described above.
- 3. The term "unaccompanied youth" includes a child or youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.
